- String cables between structures and lines from poles, towers, or trenches and pull lines to proper tension.
- Install equipment such as amplifiers or repeaters to maintain the strength of communications transmissions.
- Lay underground cable directly in trenches or string it through conduits running through trenches. ● Pull up cable by hand from large reels mounted on trucks; then pull lines through ducts by hand or with winches.
